

Minimum Eligible Requirements for the FEI WBFSH Jumping World Breeding Championship for Young Horses

The FEI WBFSH Jumping World Breeding Championship for Young Horses is organised under FEI Rules in cooperation with the World Breeding Federation for Sport Horses (WBFSH). Entries may only be submitted by National Federations (NFs). The selection procedure shall be determined by the respective NF in close cooperation with the WBFSH member studbook(s) in the respective country. Only horses registered at birth in WBFSH member studbooks are eligible to participate.

To be eligible, horses must achieve the following Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MERs):

- 5-year-old horses – 3 clear rounds in competitions of at least 115 cm
- 6-year-old horses – 3 clear rounds in competitions of at least 125 cm
- 7-year-old horses – 3 clear rounds in competitions of at least 135 cm

The required results must be achieved at CSI¹ competitions or within a National Selection Procedure organised by the NF. Results must be obtained during the calendar year of the Championship and no later than the date of definite entries.

For MERs achieved within a National Selection Procedure, NFs must apply the heights specified above for 5-, 6-, and 7-year-old horses.

The National Federation must submit a Record of Results (RoR) confirming the achievement of the MERs together with the definite entries to the Organising Committee.
